HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 53

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE PONTOTOC JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL FOR BEING RECOGNIZED AS A "STAR SCHOOL" BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND THE MISSISSIPPI SCHOOL BOARD ASSOCIATION.

WHEREAS, on September 10, 2010, the Mississippi Department of Education released the new performance labels for schools and districts under the state's accountability model that measures student performance on more rigorous curriculum and assessments and designates performance classification from highest to lowest: Star, High Performing, Successful, Academic Watch, Low Performing, At-Risk of Failing and Failing; and

WHEREAS, Pontotoc Junior High School earned the Star School label for the 2010-2011 academic school year, indicating that the school is performing above the national average; and

WHEREAS, the Mississippi School Board Association recognized the Pontotoc City School District with the prestigious Lantern Award to reflect the High Performing designation; and

WHEREAS, to be eligible, a district must achieve a Quality Distribution Index score of 180 or above, which indicates a high level of academic success, and meet the growth expectations determined by the Mississippi Department of Education; and

WHEREAS, Superintendent Adam Pugh, Principal Tony Cook and the Pontotoc City School District have a great deal in which to be proud as they continue to be an educational leader in Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, this success is not by accident, but must be attributed to teachers, students and the community for their

continued commitment and determination in supporting this special district and school; and

WHEREAS, through strong parental and community involvement, teacher and staff dedication, and student diligence, Pontotoc Junior High School not only prepares students to compete in the job market locally, but also prepares students to move toward an education that will allow them to compete globally; and

WHEREAS, State Superintendent of Public Education, Dr. Tom Burnham, has been quoted as saying, "As a state we continue to make sustained progress. Clearly, the quality of teaching and learning in the classroom in Mississippi is improving, and more importantly, student performance is improving."; and


