WHEREAS, Lee Williams was born in Tupelo, Mississippi, and still resides there today; and

WHEREAS, he grew up in a strong church-going household in which music was a part of every day life; and

WHEREAS, inspired by their uncle, a member of The Gospels Stars, Mr. Williams and his three older brothers formed a quartet, The Gospel Stars Junior—the same uncle later formed the first Spiritual QC's; and

WHEREAS, when the first group disbanded in 1964, he and his older brother, Willie, held onto the name and looked for other possible members to round out the group; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Williams supported his family as a truck driver and chose to perform in and around the Memphis area to maintain their family and church lives in Tupelo; and

WHEREAS, in the early 90s a radio announcer in the Memphis area received a copy of their cassette and helped generate their national acclaim—Mr. Williams is proud to be honored by the Jackson Music Award Association:
