Following the closing convocation of the Mississippi Governor's School, we will walk over to Poindexter Hall (two buildings away from Rent Auditorium). I believe you debated there during the campaign.

At the auditorium in Poindexter Hall, you will be making a presentation to the recipient of the 2001 Outstanding Older Worker Award for Mississippi. The recipient's name is Mrs. Essie Dickson Mitchell, 93, of Hatley, MS. Her husband was a member of the legislature during Waller's term. A copy of her nomination with all her information is attached. She will probably have about six family members there.

Brief remarks are attached. After you speak, you will have a certificate to present to her.

The National Prime Time Awards Program, which is in its fourth year, honors older workers all over the country. The outstanding worker from each state is flown to Washington, DC, for the national awards ceremony. They spend four days in DC, meeting their congressional delegation and doing the whole tour thing.
