A Proclamation By Governor Ronnie Musgrove

WHEREAS, the Mississippi State University Bulldogs 2003 baseball team finished the baseball season with an overall record of 42-20 and was ranked in the top 25 of the national polls the entire season under the leadership of Coach Ron Polk and assistant coaches Russ McNickle, Tommy Raffo and Daron Schoenrock; and

WHEREAS, the MSU baseball team currently hold the SEC's longest runs of consecutive winning seasons with 27 and 21 30-win seasons; and

WHEREAS, the Bulldogs played in their 26th NCAA postseason tournament, their 20th NCAA regional tournament (seventh in the last eight years) and hosted its 11th NCAA Regional Tournament at Dudy Noble Field; and

WHEREAS, the Bulldogs placed a school-record of 13 players on the 2002-2003 SEC Baseball Academic Honor Roll; and

WHEREAS, a school-record 8 MSU players were selected in the 2003 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, including the program's eighth first-round draft pick, Paul Maholm taken by the Pittsburgh Pirates:
