WHEREAS, the Walk of Hope is committed to raising awareness of the abuses faced by children and to alleviating human suffering and degradation in countries across the world; and

WHEREAS, at nearly sixty years of age and no athlete Norman Ball, grandfather of five, is undertaking a walk of over 8250 miles around North America—the walk was kicked off in Phoenix, Arizona in January 2001 and will officially end in Phoenix in the fall of 2002; and

WHEREAS, Norman Ball has faced harsh weather conditions, crossed eight mountain ranges, endured many long detours and even climbed through a wilderness area to re-join Interstate 5 at the Oregon border, in order to continue this journey of epic proportions and lay it all on the line to help save the abandoned, unwanted children of the world; and

WHEREAS, Norman Ball, followed constantly by his safety vehicle driven by his wife, Dianne, and another road-team member, will be arriving in Jackson, Mississippi on July 19, 2002, with the completion of over 7,000 miles of this incredible journey:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim July 2002, as

WALK OF HOPE MONTH

in the State of Mississippi.
