WHEREAS, the United States of America was founded as a nation of religious freedom, guaranteeing that all who live there may worship as they choose; and

WHEREAS, the Washington National Cathedral has been, throughout its history, our country's beacon of faith, a center of worship for all seeking God's comfort and guidance; and

WHEREAS, generations of Mississippians supported the National Cathedral's construction from 1907 to 1990 and thousands more continue to support the work of the Cathedral as our nation's house of prayer; and

WHEREAS, a day has been set aside by the National Cathedral Association to honor these people and the elected leadership of Mississippi:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim April 27, 2003, as

NATIONAL CATHEDRAL MISSISSIPPI STATE DAY

in the State of Mississippi.
