A Proclamation By Governor Ronnie Musgrove

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi has long been concerned with the health of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, chronic lung diseases, known collectively as Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD), are the fourth leading cause of death in the United States; and

WHEREAS, chronic obstructive pulmonary diseases cost the United States an estimated \$31.9 billion a year; and

WHEREAS, 16 million people in the United States have been diagnosed with some form of COPD with a similar number undiagnosed; and

WHEREAS, awareness, early detection and treatment are crucial in the prevention or slowing of the spread of lung disease in this country; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Mississippi deserve the opportunity to grow, thrive, be healthy and be informed and aware of their respiratory health and of the factors that affect that health:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim November 2002 as

CHRONIC OBSTRUCTIVE PULMONARY DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH

in the State of Mississippi to raise public awareness about the prevalence of Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease and the serious problems associated with the disease.
