Governor Appoints Jordan to Mississippi State Tax Commission

Jackson, Miss. – Governor Ronnie Musgrove has appointed Terry Jordan of Philadelphia to the Mississippi State Tax Commission for a six-year term of office ending June 30, 2006.

“Terry has a very good knowledge of the operations of the Mississippi State Tax Commission,” said Governor Musgrove. “He will work with the other commissioners to see that the Tax Commission operates in an efficient and effective manner that best serves the people of our state.”

Jordan graduated from the University of Mississippi with a Bachelor Degree in Business Administration in 1970 and his J.D. in 1972. Terry Jordan was a member of the Mississippi State Senate for four terms, serving as Chairman of Public Utilities, Interstate and Federal Corporation Committee and as Senate Majority Leader.
