A Proclamation By Governor Ronnie Musgrove

WHEREAS, DECA, a national association of marketing education students, provides teachers and members with educational and leadership development activities to merge with the educational classroom instructional program—DECA chapters attract students who are interested in preparing for entrepreneurial marketing or management careers; and

WHEREAS, to help its members develop key skills and competencies, DECA promotes competency based competitive marketing events, and achievement/recognition programs and activities on local, state, and national levels—scholarships are awarded to the top high school students who excel in DECA; and

WHEREAS, on the national level, there are 163,000 members to include Canada and Germany—throughout the State of Mississippi, DECA has a membership of 3,000 students in secondary educational institutions; and

WHEREAS, DECA was founded in the State of Mississippi in 1955 as a youth organization that prepares its members for careers in marketing, management, and entrepreneurship by providing the valuable service of developing leadership abilities, encouraging cooperation, promoting good citizenship, teaching up-to-date marketing techniques and inspiring patriotism among its members; and
