A Proclamation By Governor Ronnie Musgrove

WHEREAS, the Merchant Marine has been indispensable to our security and prosperity throughout American history; and

WHEREAS, today our merchant fleet binds us in peaceful commerce with increasingly interdependent nations of the world; and

WHEREAS, merchant ships carry the essentials of life to millions in need; and

WHEREAS, to remind Americans of the important role which the Merchant Marine plays in our national life, the Congress in 1933, designated the anniversary of the first transatlantic voyage by the Merchant Marine as National Maritime Day, and requested of the President that he issue a proclamation annually in observance of that day; and

WHEREAS, each year, men and women from every state who are serving the American Merchant Marine are honored, along with the many seamen who lost their lives in World War II;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim May 22, 2002, as

MARITIME DAY

in the State of Mississippi and encourage all citizens to participate in the various ceremonies regarding this day throughout the state.
