Governor Musgrove Appoints Lanelle Lockett Glover To State Board of Education

(Jackson, MS) – Governor Ronnie Musgrove has appointed Lanelle Lockett Glover of Meridian to the Mississippi State Board of Education. She will represent the First Supreme Court District for the unexpired term of A.M. Zeidman ending June 30, 2007.

“Lanelle Glover has first hand knowledge of the state’s educational system with over 28 years of teaching experience,” said Musgrove. “She is the type of person we need on the State Board as we work together to continue to improve our schools for our children. I am excited that she has agreed to serve and look forward to working with her.”

Glover is retired from the teaching profession after more than 28 years in the classroom. At Meridian High School, Glover taught Government, Economics, Law Related Studies, and Sociology and was Coordinator of Youth Programs. Prior to teaching in Meridian, Glover taught at Holly Springs Elementary.

In 1999, Glover received an Excellence in Teaching Award at Meridian Public Schools; in 1995, she was selected as the Star Teacher for Meridian High School; and from 1980 – 1984, she served on the Mississippi Research and Development Center Advisory Council for Governor William Winter.

Glover currently serves as a board member of the Lauderdale County Habitat for Humanity, on the Education Committee of the East Mississippi Business Development Corporation, as a member of Parents for Public Schools, and is the Administrative Council Chairperson with Central United Methodist Church.
