WHEREAS, it is important to recognize the sacrifices made by our Mississippi veterans who are paralyzed; and

WHEREAS, all Mississippians are encouraged to honor our paralyzed veterans because they personify the highest ideals of service to country, sacrifice of self and perseverance in overcoming adversity—their stories of hardship and triumph provide life-affirming lessons for all of us:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim April 14 through April 20, 2002, as

PARALYZED VETERANS OF AMERICA AWARENESS WEEK

in the State of Mississippi and encourage all citizens to observe and/or attend the activities associated with PVA Awareness Week and reflect upon the sacrifices endured by our Mississippi veterans who are paralyzed.
