A Proclamation by Governor Ronnie Musgrove

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi has historically experienced the damaging effects of hurricanes along the Gulf Coast, and the damaging effects of severe inland weather systems spawned by hurricanes; and

WHEREAS, there have been many tragic and unnecessary human casualties and there has been costly property losses, all resulting from hurricanes and related weather systems in the State of Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, human casualties and property damage can be minimized when the public is informed about and prepared for hurricanes and related weather system; and

WHEREAS, hurricane season begins on the first day of June and continues to the last day of November; and

WHEREAS, it is incumbent upon the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency and state and local governments, as stewards of the public's safety, to inform and education the public on appropriate hurricane preparedness and safety measure; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim May 29- June 2, 2000 as

HURRICANE AWARENESS WEEK

in the State of Mississippi and encourage all citizens to be informed about hurricanes and related weather system, and to take all reasonable action to protect human life and property.
