A Proclamation by Governor Ronnie Musgrove

WHEREAS, Alpha 1-Antirypsin Deficiency (A1AD) is a genetic disease of the liver and lungs that results from a lack of the protein in a person's blood which protects the lungs from germs, dust, air pollution, smoke and other inhaled irritants; and

WHEREAS, Alpha 1-Antirypsin Deficiency occurs as a liver disease in infants and early childhood; and

WHEREAS, in adults, the disease more often leads to early onset emphysema, though it is often mis-diagnosed as asthma, chronic bronchitis or early onset chronic obstructive pulmonary disease due to a lack of knowledge or understanding about this disease; and

WHEREAS, Alpha 1 is particularly devastating to families as it strikes at the peak earning and child-rearing years, and occurs as frequently as cystic fibrosis (1 in every 2,500 live births) in the United States while only 4,000 have been identified; and

WHEREAS, May will be proclaimed as National Alpha 1 Awareness Month; and

WHEREAS, screening, conferences and events will be held nationally to help raise awareness for early detection and possible organ donors; and

WHEREAS, lung transplantation is an option sought by many individuals as their disease progresses;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim May, 2000 as

ALPHA 1 AWARENESS MONTH

in the State of Mississippi and urge all our citizens to become more knowledgeable of this disease and its consequences.
