A Proclamation by Governor Ronnie Musgrove

WHEREAS, by the provisions of Section 121 of the Constitution of the State of Mississippi, the Governor is vested with the power to convene, by public Proclamation, the Legislature in Extraordinary Session whenever, in his judgment, the public interest requires it; and

WHEREAS, it is my judgment that the public interest requires that the Legislature be convened in Extraordinary Session for the consideration of the matters hereinafter stated:

NOW, THEREFORE, I Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, do hereby issue this Proclamation to convene the Legislature in Extraordinary Session, and do designate Thursday, June 29, 2000, at 12:00 noon, as the time, and the State Capitol in the City of Jackson, Mississippi, as the place, in which said Session shall be convened; and do designate as the subjects to be considered at said Extraordinary Session, when so convened, the following matters:

1. AN ACT TO REPEAL THE PROVISIONS OF HOUSE BILL 1281, ENACTED DURING THE REGULAR SESSION OF 2000, SPECIFICALLY, MISS. CODE ANN. SECTIONS 25-11-301 THROUGH 25-11-319 (AS AMENDED), TO THE EXTENT THOSE PROVISIONS PROVIDED FOR ANY INCREASE IN RETIREMENT BENEFITS FOR THE MEMBERS OF THE MISSISSIPPI LEGISLATURE AND THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE

2.An Act to be entitled:

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE LEGISLATURE FOR THE FIRST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF 2000.

Such other matters as may be submitted by the Governor for consideration during such Extraordinary Session.
