WHEREAS, he later became a farmer of cotton and rice, was elected Sheriff of Bolivar County from 1964-1968, and then entered the insurance and real estate business in Cleveland, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, Representative Capps was elected to the Mississippi House of Representatives in 1972 and is currently serving his eighth consecutive term as State Representative for House District 28 in Bolivar, Sunflower and Washington Counties; and

WHEREAS, he currently serves on the Constitution, Enrolled Bills, and Military Affairs Committees, is a member of the Joint Legislative Budget Committee, and is the current Chairman of the House Appropriations Committee; and

WHEREAS, during his legislative career, Representative Capps has been a strong advocate for education, industrial development, military affairs, and the citizens of his district and state; and
