Concerning the transportation of live wild hogs within the State of Mississippi

The Mississippi Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks, at a regular meeting in Jackson, Mississippi on June 30, 2005, under authority of Section 25-43-3.103, Mississippi Code of 1972, made known its intent to adopt and thirty days thereafter did adopt the following regulation concerning the transportation of live wild hogs within the State of Mississippi.

For the purpose of Mississippi Code Ann. §49-7-140, anyone transporting a live wild hog within the State of Mississippi, must first obtain a Twenty-Five dollar (\$25.00) Live Wild Hog Transportation Permit for each wild hog being transported. Permits may be obtained by contacting the department's 24 hour Communications Dispatcher at 601-432-2170. The permit shall be valid for 48 hours. Payment will be by personal check or money order, made payable to: MDWFP - Wild Hog Transport, and receivable within ten (10) days. Checks should also have the Permit No.(s) on the check for reference. Failure to remit payment within ten (10) days will result in suspension or revocation of hunting, fishing, and trapping privileges for one (1) year, as provided by Section 49-7-27, Mississippi Code of 1972.

A violation of this regulation is a Class III violation, punishable as provided in Section 49-7-101, Mississippi Code of 1972.

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
