Executive Session

November 20, 1985

On motion by Mr. Crosthwait, seconded by Mrs. Williams, the Board voted unanimously on Wednesday, November 20, 1985, that an executive session was necessary to discuss the following lawsuits since to do so in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the Board's litigating position:

- a. Dorothy Blankenship v. University of Mississippi Medical Center
- b. Board of Trustees v. Thomas D. Petty

On motion by Mr. Crosthwait, seconded by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously on Wednesday, November 20, 1985, to meet in executive session to discuss the above mentioned legal matters.

On motion by Mr. Crosthwait, seconded by Mr. Austin, the Board authorized its attorneys to negotiate a settlement of the Dorothy Blankenship v. University of Mississippi Medical Center lawsuit. It is expected that the settlement would be in the approximate amount of \$3,900.00.

On motion by Mr. Crosthwait, seconded by Mr. Rogers, the Board authorized its attorneys to accept settlement of the Board of Trustees v. Thomas D. Petty lawsuit. The settlement called for the payment by Dr. Petty of \$48,000.00 principal plus \$5,999.56 interest between the dates of December 15, 1985, and December 15, 1988, according to the amortization schedule set out in Attorney Jim Moore's letter of October 28, 1985.
