

PUBLIC NOTICE:
UNDER CONSIDERATION
FOR MISSISSIPPI LANDMARK DESIGNATION

Taylor-Burns House, located at 406 North 3rd Street, Columbus, Lowndes County is currently under consideration for designation as a Mississippi Landmark in compliance with the provisions of the Antiquities Law of Mississippi, Section 39-7-3 et seq. of the *Mississippi Code of 1972*, as amended.

The Antiquities Law provides that publicly-owned properties found to have significance may be designated Mississippi Landmarks by the Board of Trustees of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History. Designation recognizes the historical and/or architectural significance of the property and requires that proposed alterations that may affect the property's historic character be reviewed and approved by the Mississippi Department of Archives and History.

The Board of Trustees of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History invites public comment on the proposed designation of the Taylor-Burns House as a Mississippi Landmark.
