

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 832

WHEREAS, William Sherman, MDOC No. 12089, was sentenced on November 4, 1999, in Copiah County, Mississippi, to serve ten (10) years in the Mississippi State Penitentiary, on the charge of Unlawful Possession of More Than 10 Grams of Methamphetamine; and

WHEREAS, William Sherman, MDOC No. 12089, was on January 5, 2000, granted a conditional Governor=s Suspension of Sentence; and

WHEREAS, having reasonable cause to believe that William Sherman, MDOC No. 12089, a prisoner of the State of Mississippi, conditionally released from the Mississippi Department of Corrections, has violated the terms and special conditions of his release under Executive Order No. 820 by his failure to abide by curfew, his failure to live at his stated residence, his failure to obey the law by committing a disturbance of the peace, his failure to abide by the special conditions of his release, and for other reasons deemed sufficient by the Governor; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Corrections requested that William Sherman be returned to custody;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Law of this State, do hereby order the said William Sherman, MDOC No. 12089, to be retaken and returned to the said Mississippi State Penitentiary and into the actual custody of the Warden or Superintendent, and I hereby authorize and require you to so retake him and for so doing, this shall be your sufficient warrant.

FURTHER, this Executive Order shall supercede Executive Order Number 820.

I authorize and direct you, upon receipt of this Executive Order, to be notice and be governed accordingly.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the Sate of Mississippi to be affixed.
