Applications are now being accepted for the 2021 Eudora Welty Research Fellowship.

The Eudora Welty Research Fellowship provides a \$5,000 stipend to graduate students in support of primary source research using the Eudora Welty Collection and related materials at the William F. Winter Archives and History Building in Jackson, Mississippi. One competitive fellowship is offered each year to a student enrolled in a graduate program at an accredited college or university, with preference given to those enrolled in a doctoral program.

Funded by the Eudora Welty Foundation and cosponsored by the Mississippi Department of Archives and History, this fellowship program aims to promote the continued appreciation of Eudora Welty's life and works while also providing professional and scholarly support to graduate students. The fellow is expected to conduct research in residence at the archives for two weeks during the summer of 2021. The stipend of \$5,000 may be used to cover travel, housing, and other expenses during the fellow's stay in Jackson.

To apply for the Eudora Welty Research Fellowship, applicants must provide a research proposal (5 pages, double-spaced); the applicant's most current curriculum vitae; and a letter of recommendation submitted from an academic advisor.
