

PUBLIC NOTICE:
UNDER CONSIDERATION
FOR DEMOLITION

(Former) Meridian Police Station, located at 2415 6th Street, Meridian, Lauderdale County, is currently under consideration for demolition under the provisions of the Antiquities Law of Mississippi, Section 39-7-3 et seq. of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. Designed in 1977 by Meridian architect Chris Risher, Sr. in the Modernist style, the Meridian Police Station is a designated Mississippi Landmark.

The Antiquities Law provides that if a Mississippi Landmark would be adversely affected by public construction, alteration, or demolition, then the Board of Trustees of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History may act to place that project under consideration for a permit, and accept public comments. After the conclusion of the public comment period, the proposed project and written public comments may be placed on the Board agenda for action. Based on the public comments, the Board may act to approve or deny the permit.

The Board of Trustees of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History invites public comment on the proposed demolition of the (Former) Meridian Police Station.
